I. Course Description

An analytical study of I & II Timothy and Titus showing church order, leadership and their relevancy to the day in which we live.

II. Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will have:

- A. A Biblical basis for church government.
- B. A Biblical basis for church leaders (Elders and Deacons).
- C. A Biblical basis for the roles of men and women in the local church.
- D. A Biblical understanding of Pastoral ministry.

IV. Course Requirements

  1. Make three maps on overhead transparency of Paul's missionary journeys (on paper, as well).
  2. Make a timeline of Paul's life showing where I & II Timothy and Titus fit. (Start with the conversion of Paul – on paper and also transparency).

- C. Projects are 10% each
