

I. Course Description

This course deals with man and his relation to Christ. The creation, fall (including the complete doctrine of sin), life since the fall, and the after-life are studied. The person and work of Christ are examined, and then Christ and the application of His work to men are carefully correlated in the doctrine of salvation.

II. Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course the student will be able to:

- A. Locate certain basic scriptures sufficient to demonstrate a broad outline of each of the four doctrines of the course.
- B. Refute unorthodox views logically and scripturally:
